While abroad, students continue to pay their Case tuition rather than the tuition at their new institution. In addition there are several expenses students' financial aid can potentially help to fund. These are listed in the table below.

Housing	\$6,250	Room only
Estimated Cost for Meals	\$1,600	Students are expected to provide their own meals.
Travel and Culture Fee	\$1,600	
Passport	\$135	
Airfare	\$1,900	Based on airfare from CLE to NYC (necessary for orientation in Waterford, CT), NYC to Moscow, and Moscow to Cleveland.
Books	\$400	
Visa	\$550	This includes visa fees as well as costs for the HIV test required for the visa.
Miscellaneous Spending	\$600	Approximation for laundry, transportation, etc.
Total	\$13,035	

All of these costs are considered academic in nature and can therefore be considered for coverage from financial aid. Other expenses that may receive aid include immunizations and additional passport and visa fees for students who are not US citizens.

Please note that personal expenses such as travel, shopping, and going out to eat will not be covered, and should therefore be planned for accordingly.
