



### Trinity College Dublin – Fall 2014

While abroad, students continue to pay their Case tuition rather than the tuition at their new institution. In addition there are several expenses students' financial aid can potentially help to fund. These are listed in the table below.

Housing (self-catered)	\$6,370	Does not include meals.
Estimated Cost for Meals	\$2,700	
Books	\$275	
Passport	\$135	
Airfare	\$950	Roundtrip to Dublin
Local Transportation	\$400	Buses, trains, and trams will be available for personal use and may be necessary to commute to campus
Visa	\$400	Students are not required to purchase a Visa, but they do need to register with the Irish police.
Miscellaneous Spending	\$1,650	Can include more expensive personal purchases such as clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.
Total	\$12,880	

All of these costs are considered academic in nature and can therefore be considered for coverage from financial aid. Other expenses that may receive aid include immunizations and additional passport and visa fees for students that are not US citizens.

Please note that personal expenses such as travel, shopping, and going out to eat will not be covered, and should therefore be planned for accordingly.
