



### King's College, London: Fall 2014

While abroad, students continue to pay their Case tuition rather than the tuition at their new institution. In addition there are several expenses students' financial aid can potentially help to fund. These are listed in the table below.

Estimated Cost for Meals (self-catered)	\$1,700	King's College does not offer catered residences, so students have to provide their own meals.

Airfare	\$1,190	Round trip through Heathrow
Local Transportation	\$420	Certain accommodations are closer to the urban campus than others, but buying and applying credit to an Oyster Card will provide you a universal means to travel within London.
Visa	N/A	U.S. Citizens are not required to obtain a Visa if they are staying in England for less than six months.
Miscellaneous Spending (soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.)	\$1,720	This could include clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.
Total	\$8,335	

All of these costs are considered academic in nature and can therefore be considered for coverage from financial aid. Other expenses that may receive aid include immunizations and additional passport and visa fees for students that are not US citizens.
