



Summer Programme in European Studies

Get ready for the best summer ever! The six-week *Summer Programme in European Studies (SES)* is designed for adventurous students looking for an authentic European study experience while earning credits towards their major. Choose from a variety of courses or study tours taught in English at Maastricht University, one of the highest-ranking universities in the Netherlands. Course topics fit most majors and have a distinct European or international theme. Maastricht, birthplace of the European Union and situated on the border of the Netherlands, Belgium and Germany, is a picture perfect European town, with layers of history waiting to be discovered in its medieval city centre. Students fall in love with Maastricht's vibrant local culture and enjoy the many art and music festivals that take place throughout the summer. Centrally located in the heart of Europe, the *Summer Programme in European Studies* at Maastricht University is an ideal way for students to experience Europe inside and outside the classroom.

Inspiring courses

Courses in the SES programme focus on the economic, political and socio-cultural aspects of Europe or approach topics from a wider international perspective. Classes include exciting hands-on experiences such as field trips, museum visits and seminars on location. Visit the site of the famous Maastricht Treaty, discuss sustainable business challenges with local entrepreneurs or attend a lecture about the Dutch Golden Age while examining the actual artwork in the museum. Learn how modern Europe emerged from the crucible of the 20th Century, discover the common foundations of European law or compare European public health systems.

Maastricht University (UM), the most international university in the Netherlands, stands out for its innovative approach to learning and international outlook. Classes are typically interactive, with a limited number of students to give you easy, personal contact with the professor and fellow students. You will have classes four days per week and engage with European and other international students in a range of stimulating and challenging topics.

Programme structure

The *Summer Programme in European Studies* is divided into two 'block periods' of three weeks each. Students select one course or study tour per block period. Courses are worth 6 ECTS, study tours are 4 ECTS. In most cases, 2 ECTS are equal to 1 American credit.

Unique European study tours

The SES programme also offers two exceptional multiple-day study tours where students discover the European Union at first-hand. The study tours take students to significant organisations, companies and cultural sites that are often unavailable to the casual tourist. They form an extensive and engaging preparation for many of the courses that follow in Maastricht. The Western Europe study tour takes students to some of the most important institutions in the European Union and some of Northern Europe's most beloved cultural locales. During the Central and Eastern Europe study tour students gain in-depth knowledge of Eastern Europe's transitioning economies and budding democracies.

Practical Information

Programme dates

Summer 2014: 27 June - 8 August 2014

Introduction

The programme starts with an introduction period to get to know the university and includes a BBQ, CES services (such as airport pick up and phone rental), a tour of Maastricht and the surrounding area and integration into Dutch student life.

Amsterdam Day trip

During the introduction we take you on a day trip to Amsterdam, our beautiful capital. See where Anne Frank lived with her family, savour Dutch pancakes and take a boat tour through the Amsterdam canals. Marvel at Rembrandt's Nightwatch and Van Gogh's famous paintings with your own eyes. CES will show you the true Amsterdam: a safe city with old world charm, intimate squares, 17th century mansions, canals, and bikes everywhere!

Travel opportunities

Experiencing Europe is a big part of the programme. With classes four days a week, there are plenty of three-day weekends to explore Europe on your own. Take a short train ride to Brussels, Amsterdam, London or Paris. Catch a low-cost flight from one of seven airports around Maastricht to just about any place in Europe, including Berlin, Prague, Rome or Barcelona!

Tuition

The tuition fee includes 2 courses and registration at Maastricht University, all course materials, field trips, the Amsterdam day trip, extensive introduction and all CES services. For Summer 2014 the tuition fee is € 2200. For study tour and single block period prices, please refer to the CES website.

Housing

Most CES students stay in single or double rooms at the International Student Guesthouse of Maastricht University. Rooms in the P-building have a private kitchen and rooms in the C-building have communal cooking facilities; in both buildings the bathroom facilities are shared. Housing costs for Summer 2014 range from € 624 to € 937.

Visa & Residence Permit

Students do not need a temporary residence permit (VVR) for stays shorter than 90 days, although they might need a visa (VKV). Citizens of Visa Waiver Program countries (including the US) do not need a visa to enter the Netherlands. Visa costs are not included in the tuition fee. Insurance

Students need sufficient health care, liability and travel insurance for the duration of their stay. Most students are covered through their home university, but CES can assist students who need to purchase their own.

Application requirements

CES Open Enrolment programmes are competitive. Early application is recommended. Applicants must be in good academic standing, have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and must be proficient in English.
