While abroad, students continue to pay their CWRU tuition rather than the tuition at their host institution. In addition, there are several expenses students' financial aid can potentially help to fund. These are listed in the table below. Note that all expenses listed in the attachment are estimates to be used for financial aid purposes. **Actual costs may vary.**

Miscellaneous Spending	-	\$1,400	Can include more expensive personal purchases such as clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.
