While abroad, students continue to pay their Case tuition rather than the tuition at their new institution. In addition there are several expenses students' financial aid can potentially help to fund. These are listed in the table below.

Housing (self-catered)	-	\$3,750	The American College of Thessaloniki provides off campus accommodation in downtown Thessaloniki. Does not include meals.

Airfare	-	\$1,400	Roundtrip to Thessaloniki.
Local Transportation	€240	-	This depends on how close you live to campus.
Visa	€150	\$113	The fee may vary by Embassy (in USD). There is also a residence permit fee (in EUR).
Miscellaneous Spending	€1,300	-	Can include more expensive personal purchases such as clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.
