Local Transportation	₿10,000	-	Transportation within Bangkok is fairly cheap. There have a great Skytrain system that can get you all over the city.

Miscellaneous Spending	₿60,000	-	Can include more expensive personal purchases such as clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.
