While abroad, students continue to pay their Case tuition rather than the tuition at their new institution. In addition there are several expenses students' financial aid can potentially help to fund. These are listed in the table below.

	International Cost	Local Cost (in USD)	Notes
Housing	-	\$1,710	This price will vary depending on which dormitory you live in. The actual price may be higher or lower. This is for self-catered.
Estimated Cost for Meals	-	\$2,000	Students are expected to prepare their own meals.
Books	-	\$250	
Passport	-	\$140	If you do not already have one.
Airfare	-	\$1,000	Roundtrip to Tel Aviv
Local Transportation	-	\$200	This is buses and subways available.
Visa	-	\$75	A study visa is required for stays longer than three months.
Miscellaneous Spending	-	\$1,400	Can include more expensive personal purchases such as clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.
Subtotal	-	\$6,775	Subtotal for each column before currency conversion
