While abroad, students continue to pay their Case tuition rather than the tuition at their new institution. In addition there are several expenses students' financial aid can potentially help to fund. These are listed in the table below.

	International Cost	Local Cost (in USD)	Notes
Housing	₱ 54,000	-	This is the average cost for a self-catered, residence hall.
Estimated Cost for Meals	₱ 75,000	-	Students are expected to prepare their own meals.
Books	₱5,000	-	A lot of the book you may need can be checked out of the library free of charge.
Passport	-	\$140	If you do not already have one.
Airfare	-	\$800	Roundtrip to Moscow.
Local Transportation	₱7,000	-	Buses and subways are available.
Visa	-	\$75	A study visa is required.
Miscellaneous Spending	-	\$1,200	Can include more expensive personal purchases such as clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.
