While abroad, students continue to pay their Case tuition rather than the tuition at their new institution. In addition there are several expenses students' financial aid can potentially help to fund. These are listed in the table below.

| Airfare | - | \$1,400 | Roundtrip to Stockholm. |
| Local Transportation | kr. 2,400 | - | This is for bus passes. |
| Visa | kr. 1,000 | - | A student visa is required for stays longer than 90 days. |
| Miscellaneous Spending | kr. 9,000 | - | Can include more expensive personal purchases such as clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc. |
| Subtotal | kr. 38,250 | \$1,540 | Subtotal for each column before currency conversion |
| Converted in June of 2015 from SEK to USD* | \$ 4,538 | \$1,540 | Each column subtotal converted to USD |
