Housing (self-catered)	₩1,456,000	-	This is for a double room in the International House with no meals. You may also rent a private apartment or have a homestay.

Passport	-	\$140	If you do not already have one.
Airfare	-	\$1,200	Roundtrip to Seoul.
Local Transportation	₩420,000	-	There is an extensive public transportation system in Seoul. Purchasing a T-money card could be helpful.
Visa	-	\$80	A student visa is required.
Miscellaneous Spending	₩1,200,000	-	Can include more expensive personal purchases such as clothes, haircuts, soap, shampoo, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.
